Happy Easter!!

Here is some information from one of our church's anniversary booklets about our association with the Heifer Project...

In October, 1957, we took part in a Heifer Project through World Service. Two purebred dairy heifers (one Guernsey and one Holstein from herds of our Brotherhood members were contributed to the project.

Many members of our church contributed the cost of the heifers which were shipped to Germany.

We held a dedicatory service on the church lawn on Sunday morning, and the heifers were then trucked to Tipton, Iowa, to join other cattle from the South-Eastern Iowa area.

From Tipton the cattle were trucked to an assembly place in Pennsylvania where they were joined by a like number from a Congregational Christian Church area.

From there the cattle were trucked to the East Coast where they were shipped from New York to Bremem, Germany.

There were sixty-two cattle in the shipment, all being delivered to needy families in Germany.

Recipients agreed to give their first female offspring to another needy family.

Another interesting highlight of the project was that C. H. Krueger of our local

Brotherhood was one of the five accompanying "Cow Boys" who cared for the cattle enroute.

He personally witnessed the receipt of each heifer by their previously selected family.

The work of the Heifer Project continues to bless the world by providing a hand up to families and communities in some of the poorest places on earth. A goat, a llama, a hive of bees, and yes ... a cow ... can mean self-sufficiency and a chance for a new life.

We are proud of our long association with the Heifer Project, and of our young people as they collect all April long for the Heifer Project. The offerings will be dedicated during worship on April 30th.

The meeting was called to order by Charles Krueger, president. Pastor Dan Moore offered the opening prayer. Jessica Pitford was present via FaceTime.

The minutes for the January 15 meeting have been read and approved.

The financial reports were reviewed and discussed. The money in the Heinze Cemetery account has been moved to the Cemetery Operating account to consolidate the two accounts.

Mandy informed us that the church insurance will expire December 31, 2023. Many insurance companies no longer will insure churches built prior to 1950. Our church was built in 1940 and the educational building addition built in the 1960's. She will be looking at other possibilities for insurance.

Mandy made a motion to accept the financial reports. It was seconded by Ava and was passed.

Old Business:

The electrical work was finished as needed for insurance coverage. Charles is going to make further contacts regarding the unresolved problem with the elevator phone.

New Business:

We discussed the church music program and its importance in keeping and generating interest in attendance by members and visitors of all ages. It is important to have the church pianist, organist and a song leader to lead the congregation in new songs. We believe that the music program has always been important to the church, and we are looking at ways to continue that tradition.

We tabled discussion on compensation for choir pianist until more discussion on the music program.

A special consistory meeting will be set for review of the church by-laws.

Safe Sanctuary training is required periodically by our church insurance. This will be scheduled.

Mandy has ordered and will donate a water sensor for any water leak in the basement. The sensor is required by our insurance.

Troy will open the church during March.





The women of St. Paul helped out during the Blood Drive.























Youth Group - March 8, 2023
